Spanish Read-Alouds for Niños on Monday, November 2nd, 9th, and 16th at 10:30am.

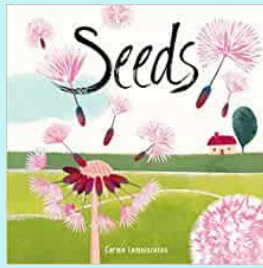

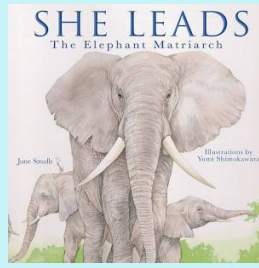
Unique Books about Plants and Animals

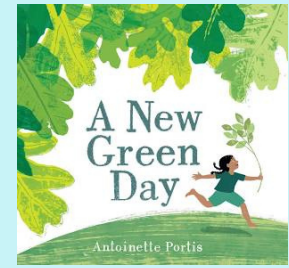
Seeds

by June Smalls

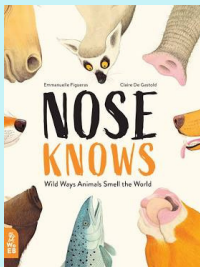

by Antoinette Portis

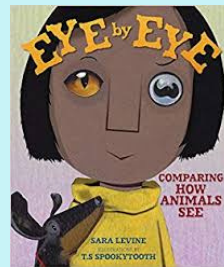

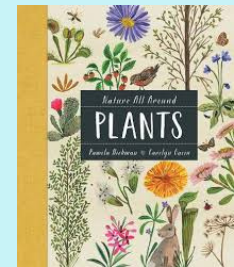
Nose Knows: Wild Ways Animals Smell the World

by Sara Levine

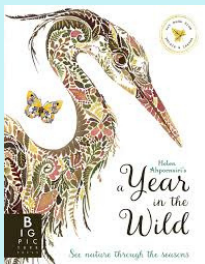

by Pamela Hickman

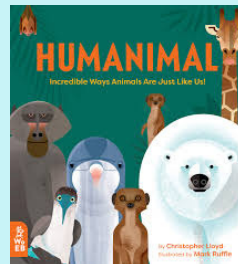

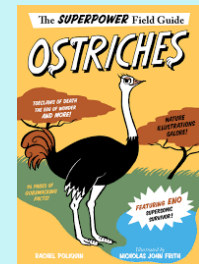
A Year in the Wild
