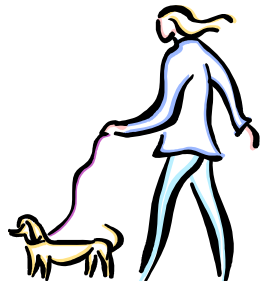


The scoop on dog poop



To insure a healthy, clean park environment, *please* use the blue plastic bags provided at various locations within the parks and dispose of your dog's waste in the nearest trash can.

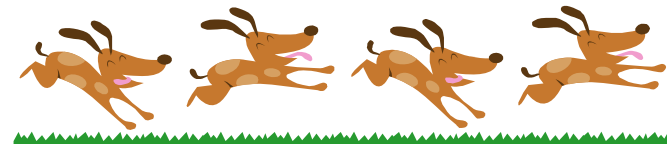


Dog Park Location

A Dog Owner's Guide

to Wilsonville parks and natural areas



The importance of keeping dogs on a leash in parks and natural areas:

- **Public Safety**-Many park visitors are frightened or uncomfortable when they encounter free-roaming dogs.
- **Protect Wildlife and Habitat**-Even the most friendly, well mannered dog can stress small mammals and destroy habitat of ground-nesting birds.
- **Preserve Water Quality**-Dog feces can contaminate streams and rivers and possibly even our drinking water.
- **It's the Law**- Wilsonville park rules require dogs to be on-leash except in the dog park located in Memorial Park.

Memorial Park has a designated off-leash area

The City of Wilsonville has designated over 2 acres of Memorial Park specifically as an off-leash dog area. This spacious park allows dogs to run as well as socialize in a fenced area. Recent upgrades include expansion of the park to the east, two potable water facilities that supply drinking water for dogs and their owners, two covered picnic shelters that provide protection from rain and sun, two separate double-gated entrances one for smaller dogs and one for larger dogs, and a new fence surrounding the park. Future improvements include seeding for better ground cover.

The dog park is located east of the sports fields in Memorial Park.
