Of course, any season of the year is the right one to find all manner of interesting and informative programs here at your library. The next time you're in the library, take a peek at our fancy new signage. We chose a 'leaves of Oregon' theme, in keeping with our hope that you'll leaf the library with more happiness than when you arrived!

And finally, before delving into this month's events, I'd like to remind you that we have a very effective volunteer-driven service that brings library materials straight to the homes of those who are disabled or otherwise physically unable to make it to the library. Now...What's happening this month?

On Saturday, June 1st, at 11am, please attend our free Space Talk: *Rockets, Rockets, and More Rockets!* In order to escape Earth's powerful gravity well, we need rockets. For a rocket to go anywhere requires a rocket engine. Perfecting the design, construction, and launch of rocket engines continues to this very day.
